Mental Health First Aid

- Most schools are training one or two members of staff in mental health first aid.
- We are training every single adult in our academies so that you have the tools you need to recognise signs of mental health issues.
- Over 800 mental health first aiders have been trained to date.
- Our first mental health hub will be opening in September.



Our E-ACT Ambassadors

Each academy has a team of **volunteer E-ACT Ambassadors** - made up of parents, community members and staff

The **Ambassadors work in conjunction with the headteachers**, academies and regional teams to help improve the academy and to **strengthen the links between the academy and the community**

Ambassadors have a direct link to the Board of Trustees with a named trustee and with the Chair of the Board who approves all appointments for our Chairs of Ambassadors

Ambassadors play a vital role in **connecting** each E-ACT academy, staff and pupils to the communities we serve

Ambassadors as a team lead on three priorities for our **Opening Minds Opening Doors strategy**, working closely with senior leaders

We aim for Ambassadors to meet every half term

Our E-ACT Ambassadors

The role fully supports our statutory duty in making sure that we **listen to and work with our parents, carers and other stakeholders** in the community in our uncompromising work to raise aspirations for every E-ACT pupil.

Ambassadors are advocates for our pupils and staff – celebrating their achievements in the community and with the community, developing the representation of each E-ACT academy in the local area.

For each Ambassador team in our academies we have to have:

at least two parent ambassadors from the local parent body

A nominated Chair of Ambassadors. Recommendations will come from the Headteacher and fellow Ambassadors. The appointment of the Chair is signed off by Chair of the Board of Trustees.

Celebration

Help to make sure that celebration of staff, pupils and parents remains a priority for the academy and to find the best way to do this.

Communication
